Recently, we introduced the online program Study Island to students in grades 6-8. This interactive, independent, online program allows students to practice skills based upon the New York State Standards in both Math and English Language Arts. Teachers and students have been using the program for about six weeks now and we're excited about the results we've seen.

Your child has been assigned an individualized username and a password to access a wide range of information. In addition to activities aligned with the New York State Standards, a major component of this online program is a host of fun, educational games that reinforce skills.

#### Goals of the Study Island Pilot Program:

- Students have access in school and at home.
- Study Island activities directly reflect New York State Standards.
- Students are highly engaged in English and Math curricula.
- Students are excited and motivated to perform at their personal best.
- Teachers are able to monitor performance.
- The Study Island activities promote higher-order critical thinking.

#### Instructions for logging on to the website:

- Open the Internet on a computer and log on to: www.studyisland.com
- To Log in: First initial of first name, full last name @ jms, (e.g. dgately@jms)
   Password: Your child's student ID number.

Children can work through a series of activities, games, and review lessons to refresh their understanding of a concept. Some teachers are beginning to post specific activities for students to complete based upon class work, while others will allow students to explore topics of interest.
