Sex Offender Registry Notification/Cureton Level - 3 Revised

The Nassau County Police Department is utilizing this form to notify you as to the existence of a registered sex offender in your area. The Police Department can release information on Level 3 (high-risk), Level 2 (moderate-risk), and Level 1 (low-risk). While the exact address on Level 3 offenders can be provided, the law provides that only 'an approximate address based on zip code' can be provided for Level 2 and Level 1 offenders.

As outlined by the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services, which oversees the Sex Offender Registry Program, persons or organizations receiving information may disseminate it to others at their discretion. It is presumed that any information received from the Registry will be used responsibly to promote public safety.
